French as a Second Language Student Enrolment Statistics 2021-2022

On December 4, Canadian Parents for French released the French as a Second Language Enrolment Statistics for the 2021-2022 school year. This yearly publication provides a quick analysis of national trends of enrolment in FSL programs by presenting the data by province and territory and by type of program.

Highlights from the 2021-2022 edition:

- At the national level, total enrollment in FSL programs continues to remain stable albeit stagnant.
- Regarding the overall percentage of students in an FSL program, Alberta, British Columbia, Manitoba, Northwest Territories and Ontario keep growing steadily.
- French immersion
 enrolment in British
 Columbia, Newfoundland
 and Labrador, Northwest
 Territories, Ontario and the
 Yukon either grew modestly
 or remained stable.
- Core French keeps steadily growing in Manitoba, Northwest Territories, Ontario and in Canada overall.
